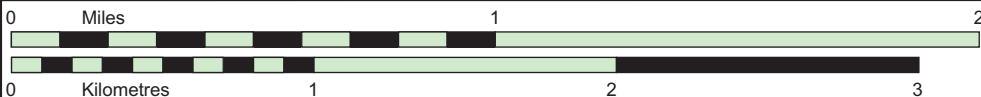


h121 Meall a' Bhuachaille from Glenmore Forest Park

Glenmore Forest Park Visitor Centre is just beyond Loch Morlich on the Cairn Gorm Ski Road East of Aviemore



The walk shown is for guidance only and should not be attempted without suitable maps.

Superb views in all directions

① Go N from the Visitor Centre (orange waymark) to ascend a grassy track to reach a junction. Bear N (left) and then follow the path as it bears NE to climb up through the forest beside a narrow burn. After crossing a wooden bridge (over the burn) the path emerges onto open moorland. Continue climbing on a clear wide path to reach a crossing path on a broad ridge. Go E (right) and follow a clear path up to the summit of Meall a' Bhuachaille (*large cairn and stone shelter*). (3 km)

② Descend E on an obvious path descending, gently at first, and then more steeply. At a fork, take either branch (they join up again) and descend to reach a crossing track at Ryvoan Bothy. (1¹/₂ km)

② Go S (right) at the bothy and follow the track SW to reach a junction of tracks (*signs for 'Nethy Bridge' & 'Braemar'*). Continue SW (straight-on) past An Lochan Uaine, ignoring a path on the right, to reach a fork. Go W (right) to cross Allt na Feith Duibhe via a bridge (sign 'Glenmore Forest') and continue beyond to reach a minor road at Glenmore Lodge. Follow the road W past Glenmore Lodge to reach the Reindeer Centre and the Cairn Gorm Ski Road. Go NW (right) to return to the Visitor Centre and the start. (4 km)

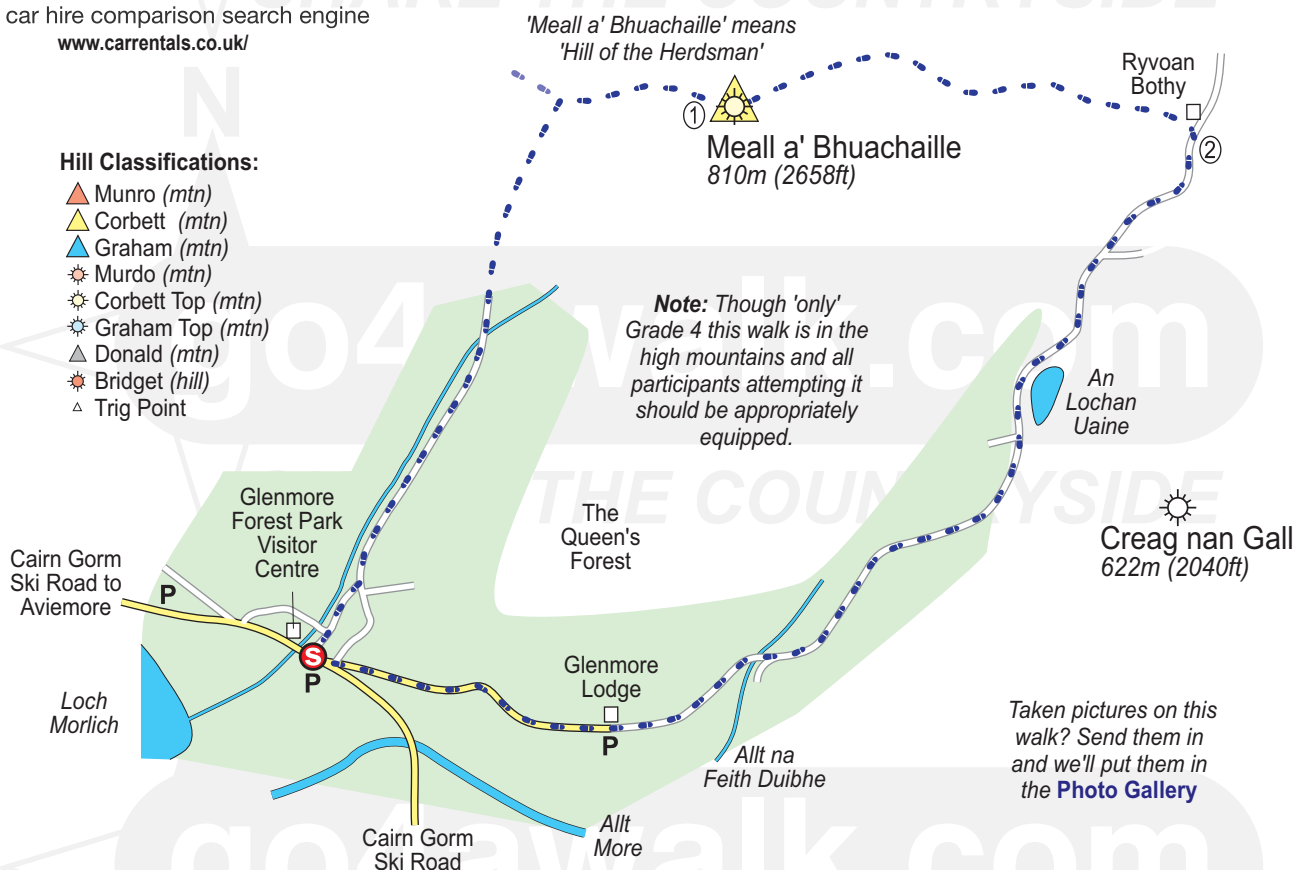

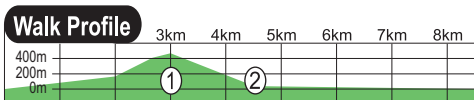
