### Quiet country paths

Go S past the pub and cross the A428 to follow Newton Lane for 70m. Go E (left) on a track (signed 'Circular Walk') and continue E over stiles to enter Turvey Abbey Park. Cross the park's drive and follow a stream E. At a stone bridge and junction of paths bear SE (half-right) away from the stream aiming for the left-hand side of an enclosed copse. Continue SE beyond the copse over a stile to reach a crossing track and stream. (1½ km)

Go SW (right - signed 'CR') on a track between Grotto Plantation and open fields. Bear SE (half-left) with the edge of the plantation to reach a railway bridge. Cross and go S (half-left) on a bridleway that follows the edge of 2 fields before continuing SE between two hedgerows for 200m. (1½ km)

Go SW (right - signed 'CR') along field edges to reach a wood. Bear S (half-left) with the path (signed 'CR') & follow field edges to past three small woods to reach a T-junction of paths. Go SW (right - signed 'CR') to follow a field perimeter round to the S to reach Ramacre Wood. (2 km)

Go W (right - signed 'CR') to reach a road. Continue W (right) on the road, past the access road to Turvey Farms to reach a T-junction beside a house. (1½ km)

Go N (right) on the road for 20m & then continue N (signed 'CR') when the road bends W to follow a clear bridleway down past Gullet Wood & up to a road at Keepers's (Church's) Cottage. (1¾ km)

Go N (left) on the road. After recrossing the disused railway & following the road round to the W leave it and go N (right) on a footpath beside a wood (signed 'CR'). Continue N to rejoin your outward route beyond a stile. Go W (left) and retrace your steps back to Turvey & the start. (1¾ km)

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Dating from the 13th Century Turvey Bridge is thought to be the site of oldest bridged crossing in Bedfordshire.

Opened in 1872, the Bedford-Northampton railway finally closed to rail traffic in 1962.

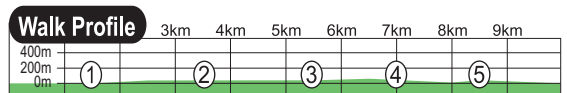
