

# gl159 Great Rissington from Bourton-on-the-Water

Bourton-on-the-Water is off the A429 Cirencester to Moreton-in-Marsh Road

The walk shown is for guidance only and should not be attempted without suitable maps.

## A stroll through the Cotswolds

① Go NW on Rissington Road (towards Bourton-on-the-Water) and then NE (right) on Station Road past a Texaco Garage. Just before the road bends N go S (sharp right) by Yew Tree Cottage to follow a lane SE until it bends E (half-left) to reach two gates. Go NE through the right-hand one for 50m and then SE (right) on a narrow path between two large ponds. Skirt E and then N round the northern pond before going E (right) over a dilapidated bridge and stile to cross fields. Continue across two bridges over two streams to reach the access road to Rissington Mill. (2 km)

② At a junction continue S on a brideway track between Orchard Cottage and Badgers Bank. Follow the track through fields until it suddenly turns W (right). Continue S along a field edge and then W (right) over a stile for 30m before going S (left) again across a field to reach a road via the access road to Glebe Farm. (2 km)

③ Go NW (right) on the road (Leasow Lane) bearing NW across Dick Bridge to reach a junction. Go WSW (left) to reach & cross the humped New Bridge to reach a brideway about 300m beyond the bridge. (2½ km)

④ Go N (right) on a brideway to reach a lane. Continue NNW on the lane past Marshmouth Farm & bear E (right) at Tagmoor Hollow to recross the river Windrush and reach the outskirts of Bourton-on-the-Water. Bear N (left) to reach the main road. Go NW (left) to return to the car park and the start. (3½ km)

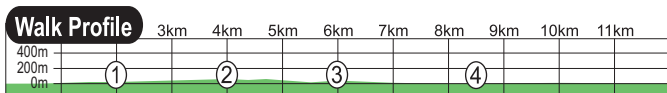
