Fields and quiet lanes - can be overgrown

① Go N from the church and then W (left) on a track (The Marches Way) that skirts the edge of wood below Grinshill to reach a road. Cross and continue NW on the road opposite before going SW (left) past 'The Vicarage' onto a track between two fences. Enter a field via a gate at the end of the track and go SW across fields to reach a lane. Go WNW (right) on the lane to reach a junction. Go SW (left) under the railway and then SSE (left) on a lane at the next junction. Follow the lane SE and SW past Yorton Villa Farm until it suddenly bends W. (4 km)

② Go E (left) on a track and then immediately S (right) on a path right next to a house. Cross a small bridge and stile, bear left and then right along a field edge parallel to a hedge (on your right). After 100m go round the depression in the ground to enter the field ahead of you through a hedge via a ramshackle stile. Continue S and SW across fields to reach a road. (1 km)

③ Go SE (left) on the road and then E (left) at a junction. Continue E on the road to reach a T-junction just after recrossing the railway. Go NE (left) and follow the road round to the E to reach a Shropshire Way sign opposite the access road to Hardwicke Stables. (2 km)

④ Follow the Shropshire Way N across fields and a lane before joining Sandy Lane to return to Grinshill and the start. (2½ km)

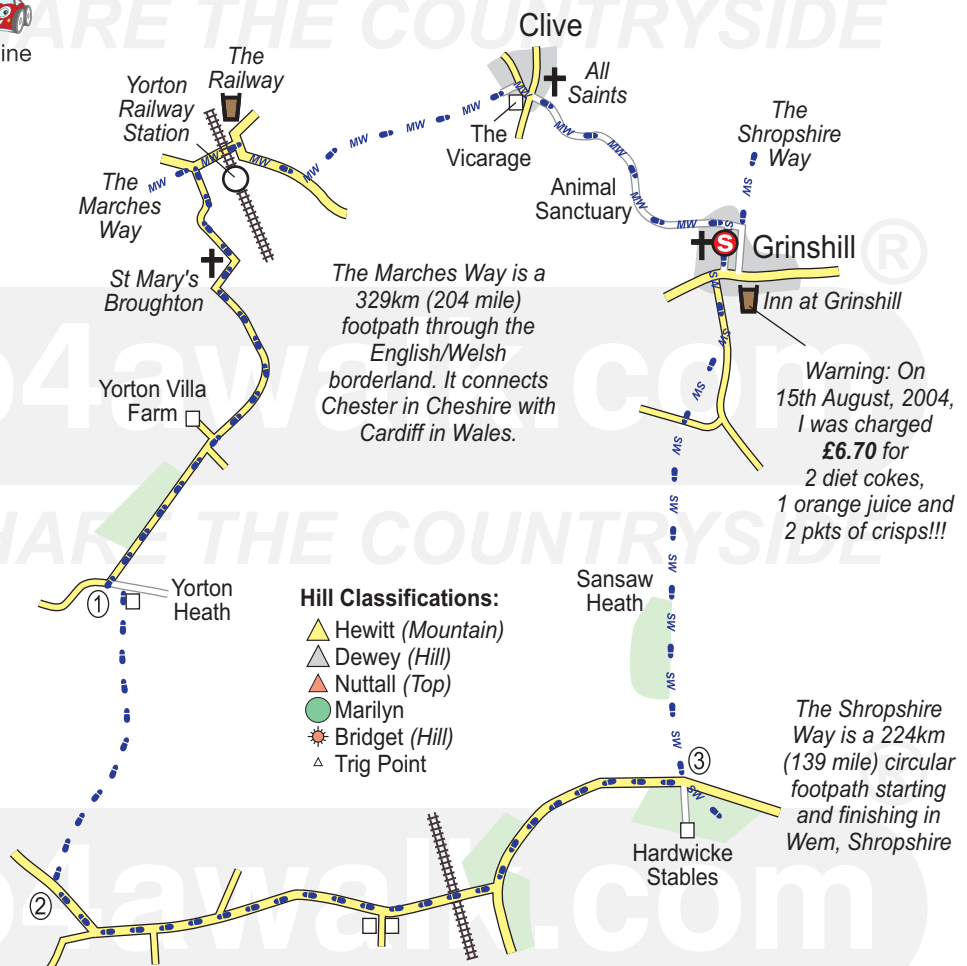

The Marches Way is a 329km (204 mile) footpath through the English/Welsh borderland. It connects Chester in Cheshire with Cardiff in Wales.

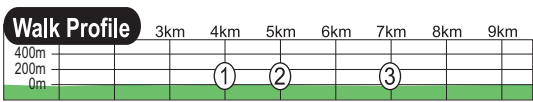
